Yard Maintenance & Compliance

Per Article 5 Section 5.15 Landscaping and Maintenance of the Associations CC&Rs the following guidelines must be adhered to for your property to be considered in compliance.

<u>Weeds:</u> Please check the front and side yards as well as the curb strip between the sidewalk and the street in front of your home. Dead weeds should be pulled or raked away. *Please bear in mind, if you reside on a corner Lot you are responsible for the maintenance of the yard and curb strip on the side of your home as well as the front. With monsoon season fast approaching it is ideal to use to a pre-emergent application to slow down the growth process of monsoon weeds.*

<u>Desert Broom</u>: A shrub-like weed with broom-like stems that can reach 12-foot tall heights. This invasive weed can crowd out other plants and steal valuable water.

<u>Dead Vegetation</u>: If the bush/shrub or tree is not showing new growth it is dead and will need to be replaced within 30 days. If the bush/shrub or tree is alive and showing growth on the bottom portion you will need to remove the dead tops/branches.

<u>Trimming</u>: All trees should be trimmed to provide a distinct canopy (a minimum of 8 foot clearance) and should be clear of all growth (suckers) around the trunk and tree base. Tree limbs are to be trimmed so that the address plate on the front of the home is not obscured. Dead branches should also be trimmed away to encourage regrowth. All shrubs should be trimmed (height not to exceed 4 feet) and well-manicured and should not encroach upon the sidewalk or drive way areas. Large portions of ground cover plantings must be kept well pruned and at a low height.

<u>Plant and Tree Debris</u>: Any leaves, pods, dead branches or other vegetation matter must be raked and cleaned from your yard.
